- All pre school children born between 2/7/13 and 1/9/2015 will be offered the vaccine at the surgery.
- All primary school children will receive the vaccination at school.

FLU VACCINATIONS 2017

The flu vaccination programme will begin on

1st October 2017

or when vaccines are delivered to the Surgery. All patients over 65years and "at risk" patients (including pregnant women at any stage of pregnancy) should be vaccinated against flu. It is important that you get your flu vaccination in October or November to be ready to fight off infection.

Shingles vaccination

The shingles vaccine is being phased in over the next few years. All people aged 70yrs on



1/9/17 will be offered the vaccine as well as those aged 78yrs on 1/9/17. People who are now aged 71,72,73,74,or 79 yrs of age who have not already received the vaccine remain eligible to receive the vaccine during 2017/18.

The vaccine will then be rolled out to other people in the seventies age group in future

If you were born between 2/7/1996 & 1/7/2001 and you have not received the MenACWY vaccine. You are still eligible to receive the vaccine up until the age of 25yrs.
